On 27th September, Hong Kong Shue Yan University celebrated the renaming of the Centre for Interdisciplinary Evidence-based Practice and Research in honour of Mrs Dorothy Koo and Dr Ti Hua Koo, who donated HK\$35 million to support the University's development.

HKSYU Senior Vice President Professor Catherine Sun Tien-lun began the ceremony by thanking the couple for their benefaction on behalf of the University. She said Dr. Koo and Mrs Koo are keen admirers of HKSYU's educational ideals and are impressed by the unity of the faculty and staff. As a gesture of appreciation, a HK\$35 million gift was made to support campus development and academic research.

The newly renamed "Mrs Dorothy Koo and Dr Ti Hua Koo Centre for Interdisciplinary Evidence-based Practice and Research" at the Research Complex will be given HK\$5 million for training and research. The donation will also fund the renovation of the 35th Anniversary Plaza at Lady Lily Shaw Hall to provide Shue Yan students with a sophisticated venue for various artistic performances. A renaming ceremony for the 35th Anniversary Plaza is expected to be held early next year.

Prof. Sun pointed out that a collision of interdisciplinary perspectives is what it takes to resolve complex societal challenges in the digital era. Taking aging population as an example, sociology can study how an ageing population consumes societal resources, while social work can assist the elderly in making the best use of those resources. Psychology, meanwhile, encompasses the study of emotional and cognitive changes in the elderly, and neurology can precisely identify the causes and remedies for various forms of cognitive decline.

HKSYU Vice President (Graduate School) Professor Catherine Tang So-kum, also the director of the newly renamed centre, also took the opportunity to introduce its five-year research plan. She said the centre aims to establish an interdisciplinary platform to promote and develop professional knowledge in evidence-based practice and research. The initiative will enhance training and education for teachers and students. The centre will also seek to establish and strengthen connections between the University and community partners through collaborative design and implementation of evidence-based practice and research projects.

In response to escalating concerns over youth mental health, Hong Kong Shue Yan University announces its partnership with Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups to launch a project aimed at promoting social and emotional learning among primary school students.

The project titled “Emotion World: Enhancing Middle Primary School Students’ Emotional Competence Via a Holistic, Integrative, Gamified Platform” is co-led by Professor Catherine Tang, Vice President (Graduate School) and Distinguished Professor of Psychology, and Dr. Jason Chow, Associate Academic Vice President (Teaching and Learning Development) and Associate Professor in the Department of Counselling and Psychology. This project will adopt a comprehensive approach to address the critical need for emotional competence development among primary school students. It integrates both online and offline counselling, and will provide capacity building workshops for students, teachers and parents. Moreover, the project team will design digital games to enhance deep learning of emotional skills, creating an engaging and immersive experience for the participants.

This project has won a funding of 27.36 million from the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trusts, with 18.86 million allocated to the Mrs. Dorothy Koo and Dr. Ti-Hua Koo Centre for Interdisciplinary Evidence-based Practice and Research at Hong Kong Shue Yan University. It is anticipated to benefit 5,000 primary school students, in addition to their parents and teachers, representing a significant step towards addressing systemic challenges in promoting mental health and emotional well-being among Hong Kong’s youth.

Dr. Jason Chow stated that this collaborative effort underscores Shue Yan University's commitment to leveraging digital technology and evidence-based research to make a meaningful impact on society. Furthermore, it aligns with the centre's mission to promote intergenerational health. In the future, there are plans to expand the project to different age groups and incorporate more advanced technology such as AI chatbot and VR-assisted training.

Miss Helen Kwok, the Assistant Director of the Mrs Dorothy Koo and Dr Ti-hua Koo Center for Interdisciplinary Evidence-based Practice and Research, suggested that there is a general lack of teaching materials for enhancing primary school students' emotional competence in the society, and she expected that this project could help students developing emotional skills via gamified and immersive learning experience.

Through the partnership between Shue Yan University, the Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust, and the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, the Project aims to empower the next generation with essential skills and support to navigate life's emotional complexities effectively.



Centre Research Theme 2023 - 2027

Intergenerational Research on Well-Being & Quality of Life

The Centre will focus on research in relation to intergenerational well-being and quality of life. It aims to identify patterns of continuity or change in beliefs, values, and various attributes across generations, as well as the mechanisms that facilitate or hinder their transmission in shaping well-being and quality of life of different generations. Its findings will have significant research and practical implications in informing the development of programmes, interventions, and policies that promote positive outcomes of individuals, families, and the society.

Break the Silence: Survey Findings on Public Attitude and Knowledge Towards Pregnancy Loss

Based on statistics from the Hong Kong government, it is estimated that approximately one in five pregnancies may result in pregnancy loss, with an average of 8,000 cases recorded annually in recent years. Despite the high prevalence of pregnancy loss, there remains a pervasive taboo surrounding the topic. This silence, coupled with misconceptions and stigma, exacerbates the psychological and social challenges faced by bereaved parents. In their presentation, Mr. Chris Ng and Ms. Sherman Zhang will present the findings on Public Attitude and Knowledge Towards Pregnancy Loss in Hong Kong. The study reveals that myths related to pregnancy loss persist in society, and well-intended expressions of condolence may unintentionally have a negative impact on bereaved parents. The study is part of the "Jockey Club Perinatal Bereavement Care Project (JCPBC)," a new initiative aimed at providing support for individuals and couples who have experienced pregnancy loss. Key components of the initiative include the development of an online perinatal bereavement support platform, community education, and professional training.

Speaker: Mr. Chris Ng

Mr. Chris Ng is the Project Manager of Jockey Club Perinatal Bereavement Care Project at the Department of Social Work and Social Administration, The University of Hong Kong. He is a registered social worker for nearly 25 years. He is one of the few in Hong Kong who has extensive work experience in the field of psycho-oncology for adult and children cancers. His research interest includes men support, psychosocial interventions for people touched by cancers and online intervention.

Ms. Sherman Shuwen Zhang is a Medical Social Worker of the Jockey Club Perinatal Bereavement Care Project at the Department of Social Work and Social Administration, the University of Hong Kong. She has experiences working with families and individuals facing a range of challenges including infertility and pregnancy loss, autism spectrum disorders, couple conflicts, child maltreatment and etc.

Cyberbullying among internet users, particularly young people, has become a growing public health concern in recent years due to its potential negative psychological impacts. This seminar will synthesize key findings from over two decades of research examining risk and protective factors related to cyberbullying perpetration and victimization. Dr. Leung will provide an overview of predictive individual characteristics and contextual influences that have been associated with cyberbullying involvement based on recent literature. Specifically, she will discuss studies exploring potential roles of cyber-bystanders in cyberbullying. Recent investigations into factors motivating helping behaviors among witnessing peers will also be reviewed. Additionally, Dr. Leung will outline current research evaluating interventions aimed at combating cyberbullying, including values-based educational programs. Attendees will gain insights on understanding and preventing cyberbullying from multiple levels based on empirical findings presented in this seminar.

Speaker: Dr. Angel Nga Man Leung

Dr. Angel Nga Man Leung's research focuses on understanding and preventing cyberbullying among youth populations. She has received over \$2 million in funding from the Research Grants Council of Hong Kong to support three major projects examining risk and protective factors for cyberbullying perpetration and victimization, and two internal teaching grants (over \$68k) to promote students' awareness on cyberbullying and hopeful thinking. Dr. Leung has recently co-edited the upcoming book "Cyberbullying and Values Education: Implications for Family and School Education" which synthesizes current knowledge on interventions. In addition to cyberbullying, Dr. Leung's work has explored online social interactions and links between digital behaviors and mental health issues.

In 2020, Hong Kong experienced negative population growth due to low fertility rates and longer life expectancy, a trend seen in other Asian regions. With 19.6% of the population being elderly, Hong Kong has become an aging society, affecting dependency ratios, the labor force, pensions, housing, technology, and healthcare. Increasing fertility is crucial to address population aging, but the extremely low fertility rate in Hong Kong poses a challenge. While attracting skilled immigrants to give birth in Hong Kong is seen as a solution, an alternative could involve tapping into the well-established South Asian communities in Hong Kong, which currently make up approximately 1.4% of the total population of 7.4 million. These communities include many young individuals of South Asian descent who were born and raised in Hong Kong, spanning multiple generations. These individuals are Hong Kong citizens and possess core citizenship. Amidst a new wave of outmigration in Hong Kong, considerable focus in mass media and academia has been placed on documenting the experiences of Chinese Hong Kongers. However, little attention has been given to the city's South Asian population. In this seminar, Prof. Kwok will present findings from two studies that specifically examine the social participation, aspirations, and considerations of young South Asians in terms of staying or leaving the city. Drawing upon the exit, voice, and loyalty model (Hirschman, 1970), Prof. Kwok will discuss the factors that contribute to and hinder the sense of loyalty towards Hong Kong, as well as the opportunities for these young individuals to voice their concerns. In terms of policy implications, it is crucial not only to reduce the barriers faced by South Asian youth but also to recognize their aspirations and valuable contributions to Hong Kong society, rather than neglecting their potential talents, which exerts far-reaching implications on population aging.



Speaker: Prof. KWOK Kim
 Kim Kwok is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Social and Behavioral Sciences at City University of Hong Kong. She specializes in social work, ethnic studies, and migration studies, having earned her PhD from the University of Vienna. Her research focuses on marginalized populations in contemporary multicultural societies, including migrants, individuals with diverse sexual and gender identities, and children with special needs.

Despite the importance of understanding Metaverse Gaming Experience Value (MGEV) for the design and prosperity of metaverse gaming, prior research has not yet provided context-specific theoretical knowledge of its dimensions and roles, nor offered practical insights into enhancing experience value among metaverse gaming players. To address this knowledge gap, we conducted an abductive, multi-study investigation to develop a multi-dimensional typology of MGEV, demonstrate its nomological validity, and propose a person-centered approach for investigating MGEV. First, we performed qualitative manual coding of online textual reviews to identify six MGEV dimensions and proposed a two-axis typology of the MGEV that categorizes these dimensions according to both motivation (intrinsic versus extrinsic) and activeness-based (active versus reactive) perspectives. Second, based on a total of 7,381 reviews of 75 Metaverse gaming experience providers over seven years, we developed a deep-learning classification model to automatically code the textual data and composed a panel dataset. Then, using the panel dataset, we demonstrated the nomological validity of the MGEV typology by validating the relationships between MGEV dimensions and players' word of mouth. Third, we applied a person-centered approach to the coded data using cluster analysis and uncovered three player groups with diverse MGEV profiles (i.e., intrinsic value-dominated, extrinsic value-dominated, and mixed) and metaverse gaming participation characteristics. Our work contributes to theory and practice by identifying the context-specific and fine-grained dimensions of MGEV, establishing a valid MGEV framework, and revealing multiple player groups with different MGEV profiles.



Speaker: Dr. Phil Zhou, Zhongren
 Zhongren (Phil) Zhou is an Associate Professor at the School of Economics and Management at Tongji University. He holds two Ph.D. degrees from the University of Science and Technology of China and the City University of Hong Kong. His current research interest focuses on the usage and impacts of emerging digital technologies (especially those related to artificial intelligence and the Metaverse) for sustainable development. He has published 60+ publications, including 40+ journal articles in *Journal of Management Information Systems*, *Journal of Business Ethics*, *European Journal of Information Systems*, *Information & Management*, *Decision Support Systems*, *Journal of the Association for Information Science and Technology*, and others. Phil is currently Guest Associate Editor for *Journal of Management Information Systems* (special issue on the Metaverse), Senior Editor for *Information Systems Journal* (where he is also co-editing a special issue on QC) and *Information Technology and People*, and Associate Editor for *Electronic Commerce Research and Applications* and *Industrial Management & Data Systems*.

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

This talk discusses the mechanisms and strategies to enhance Chinese and English learning based on empirical longitudinal studies. The importance of good foundation of oral skills in both Chinese and English reading is highlighted. While learning to read English requires phonological awareness additionally, morphological awareness and orthographic awareness are emphasized in Chinese reading. Specific strategies of enhancing children's Chinese and English abilities will be discussed.
