本計劃主要希望幫助需要照顧有特殊需要兒童(如過度活躍 症、自閉症、學習障礙、肢體殘疾等)(5至11歲)之家長,透 過家長小組(每節約有10名家長參與)形式,讓他們學習各 種管教技巧及親子溝通方法以更有效照顧子女,小組將由 註冊心理輔導員或註冊輔導心理學家帶領,諮詢及督導將 由資深註冊遊戲治療督導及註冊臨床督導提供。
