## Exploring Parental Gender Roles in Hong Kong Children's Literature: Equality or Stereotypes?

This study examines the depiction of parental roles in Hong Kong children's picture books published between 2012 and 2022, focusing on whether these books portray parents as equals or reinforce traditional gender stereotypes. We analyzed 29 picture books using quantitative content analysis, recording the textual and visual frequency of parental appearances, mentions, emotional expressions, disciplinary actions, nurturing behaviors, daily caregiving activities, and economic roles. The findings reveal a significant imbalance in the portrayal of parental roles in Hong Kong's picture books, with mothers shown as primary caregivers and fathers as less engaged figures. This study highlights the need for more balanced depictions of parents in children's literature to support gender equality in socialization processes.
